



Annual Performance Overview

Over the past year, Sam3 Mahmoud Foundation has continued its commitment to expanding access to hearing healthcare services for underserved communities across Egypt. Through the generous support of our partners and donors, the Foundation has successfully delivered essential hearing care interventions that have significantly improved the lives of children and adults with hearing loss.

Key Achievements

During the reporting period, the Foundation achieved the following:

- 338 beneficiaries were registered and received assessment, consultation, and follow-up services through our hearing care programs.
- 33 hearing aids were provided to individuals with hearing loss, including 10 children (up to 18 years old) and 23 adults.
- 48 cochlear implant maintenance services were completed, benefiting 46 children and 2 adults.

Impact

Each hearing aid provided and every cochlear implant maintenance service represents more than a medical intervention—it restores communication, promotes educational inclusion, strengthens social participation, and enhances the quality of life of individuals living with hearing loss.

Through these services, children gained better opportunities to develop speech and language skills, continue their education, and actively participate in their communities. Adults also benefited from improved communication, greater independence, and enhanced social and economic engagement.
